#### STAFF VACANCIES AND UPDATES

ASSOCIATE PASTOR. Within ten days of The Rev. Marie Mickey's final payroll days (June 15), Session Elders began a visioning process related to ministry needs, church talent, gifts, opportunities, and challenges. This process now moves to the phase of congregational participation on the Saturdays of August 12 and September 9. Everyone's participation is crucial for deciding if FPC will search for an associate pastor fulltime or part-time or pursue a future staffing arrangement without an associate pastor.

BOOKKEEPER. With the resignation of Bonnie Chandler on July 27, interviews of candidates are being conducted by the Administration Committee in partnership with the Church Treasurer.

ORGANIST/PIANIST. Since the news of Steve Gentry accepting another position locally, the Director of Music and Pastor are engaged in contacting/networking with professional colleagues and musicians for a candidate interested in and capable of serving in this role.

CHILDREN'S CENTER DIRECTOR. Children's Center Ministry Committee has invited applicants and began interviewing candidates. For now, Kaity Gillispie serves as Interim Director.

DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION. Kathryn Nachlinger currently works part-time on a contract basis to assist FPC with limited seasonal Christian Education ministry leadership needs. While this position is currently "open" and is not staffed by a "permanent hire," this ministry is included in the overall ministry assessment inventory undertaken by Session and congregation in relation to the vacant Associate Pastor position.

### 150<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY CHURCH SCHOOL CLASS; OBSERVATIONS (1867-1914)

Related to the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary year of FPC-Bryan (which is now!) . . . A review of the minutes of Session and of a few congregational meetings from the church's chartering in 1867 until the 1914 dedication of the 1906 building yield impressions such as:

- 1. This was an "old school" Presbyterian congregation, meaning that the elders, pastors, and members (generally-speaking): (a) trusted the Holy Spirit to have inspired the Bible as God's Word; and (b) trusted individuals and the elders to judge and evaluate the leadership of God's Spirit by outward relationships and conduct.
- 2. Advocated moral behavior in the community, and the elders were willing to investigate and censure "immoral" behavior.
- 3. Took seriously requests from other churches and individuals in the community, including a request from former slaves who desired to have a Presbyterian minister preaching among them.
- 4. Was open to those willing to serve the church even before a person might become an official member.
- 5. Did not dedicate the building built in 1906, until the building mortgage was paid in 1914.



**AUGUST 27** Romans 12:1-8
